Confirm the document you've used for creating the UKVI account.

Take images of your document. For BRP, you need to scan the back side and then the front side of the card. You must have your documents at hand to complete this step.

You will scan the chip in your document using your phone.

You will scan your face.

You will take a facial photo, this will be your eVisa photo. You can take a selfie or ask someone else to take it for you.

Your application may be rejected if you do not provide all mandatory documents. If your application is rejected due to documents not being provided, it will not be considered and an administration fee for each person included in the application will be deducted from your refund.
