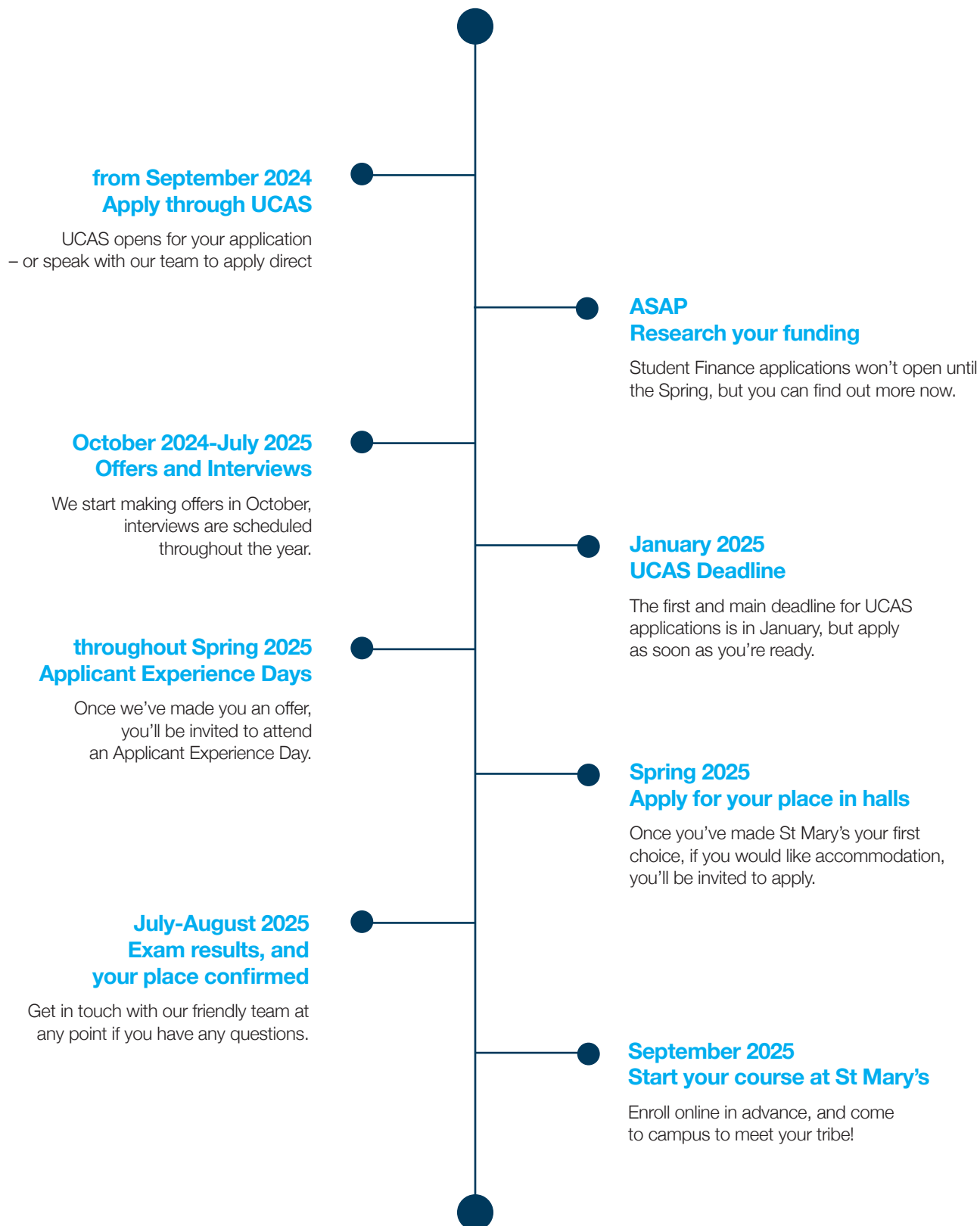

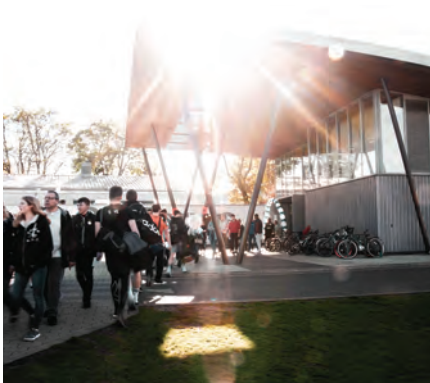

Tours

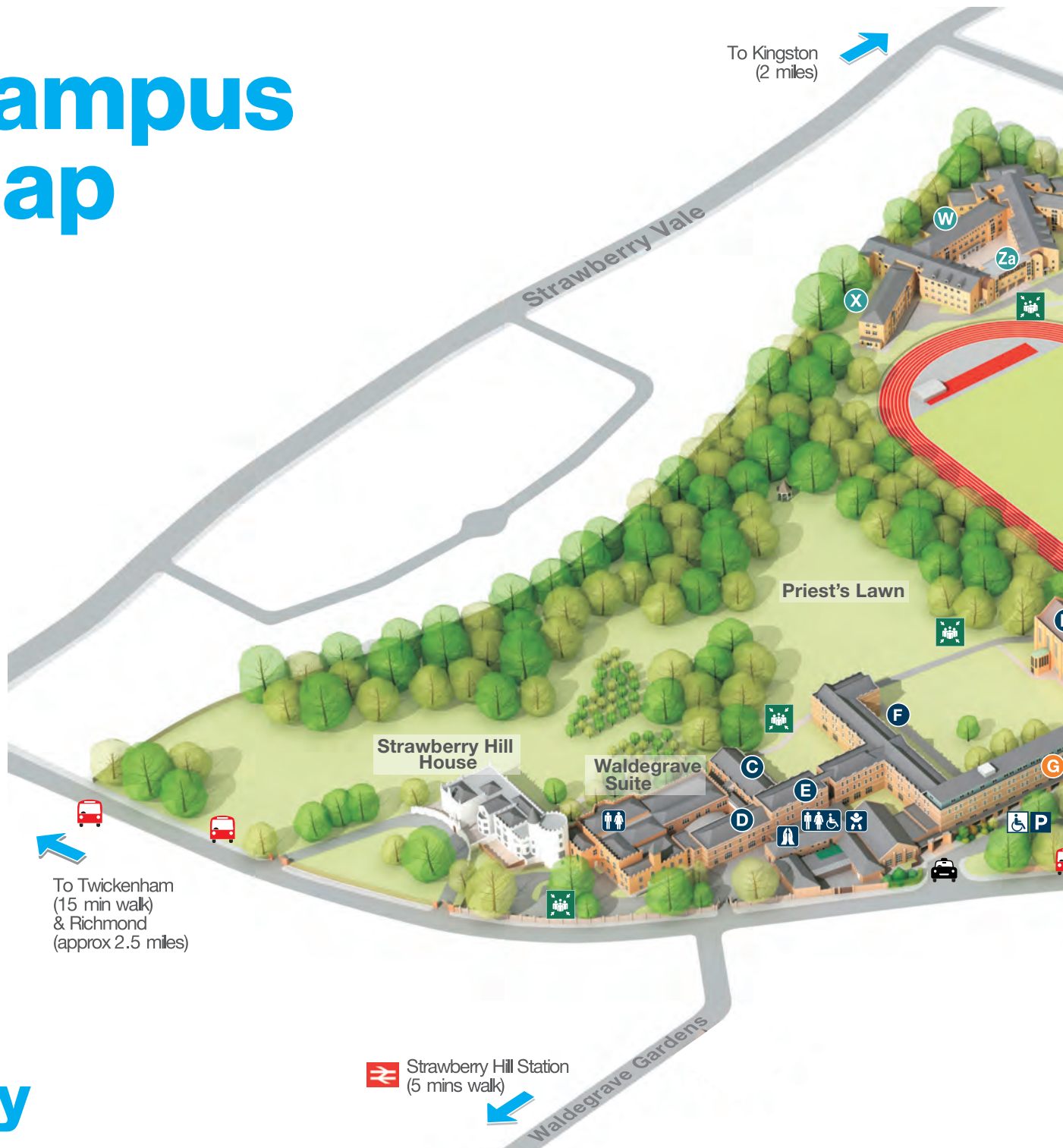

Campus map



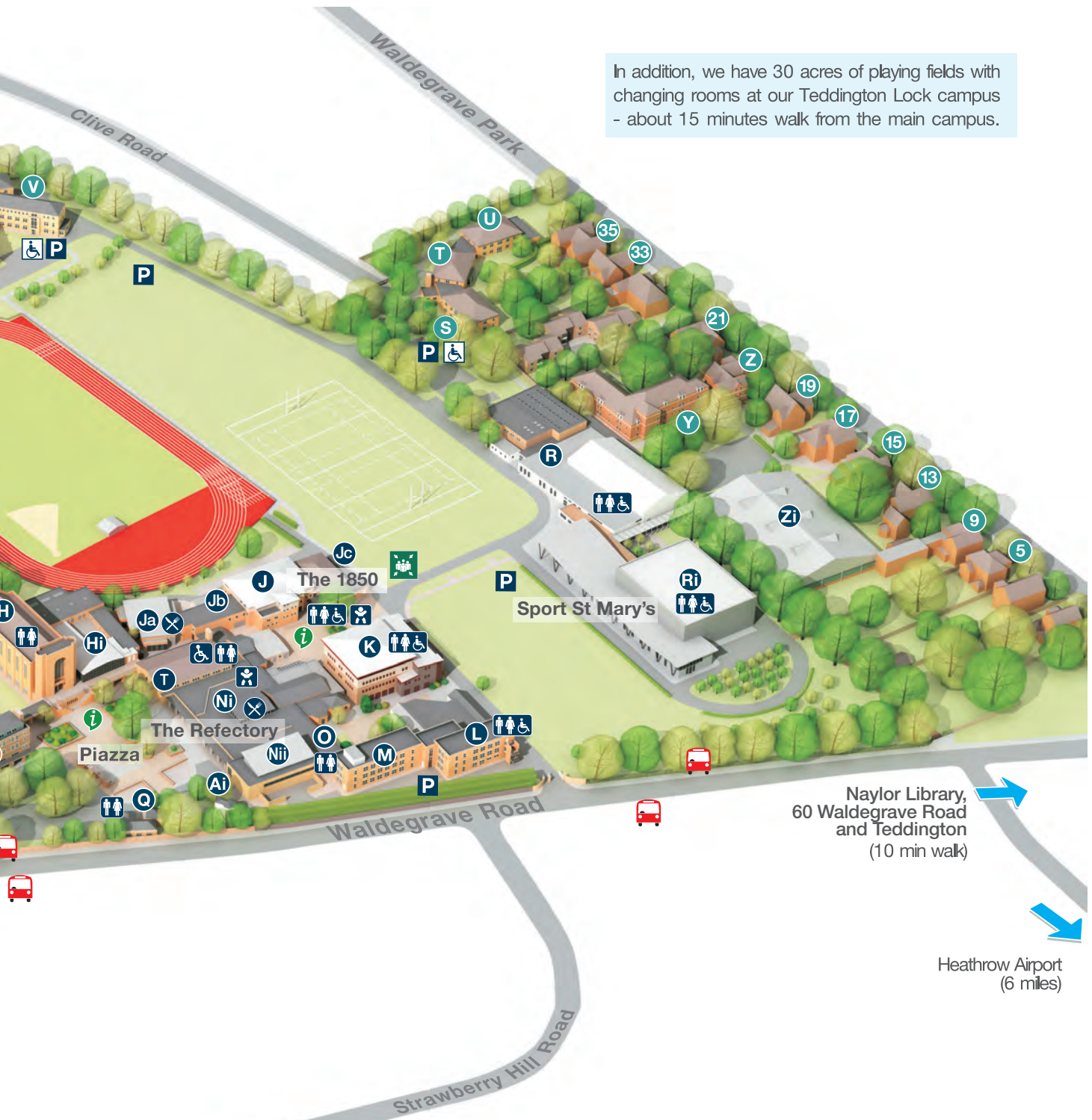

Each year, SMSU holds elections for the new leaders of the organisation: the Education President and Student Life President, as well as the introduction of four new Vice-Presidents this year (Inclusion, wellbeing, postgraduate, international). These roles, along with course rep and subject chair roles, give you a fantastic opportunity to be part of the democratic voice for St Mary's students and for students at a national level.

Events

We run a range of events to give you new experiences – whether that's cheering on your friends at Varsity, riding the ferris wheel at Welcome Fest, or dancing the night away at Summer Ball.

Supporting you

We work to ensure that you have access to the right support whenever you need it by working collaboratively with the University to ensure your welfare needs are met. We lead many welfare and diversity campaigns throughout the year, including Mental Health Awareness and LGBTQ+ history. We can advise on a range of issues or help to signpost you to professional services on and off campus. 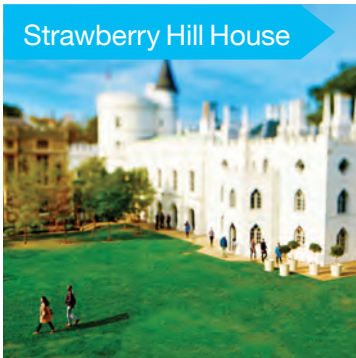

Local area

If you're staying in the area for the weekend, or have some free time after your visit, why not explore the local area and its rich heritage, including sites of cultural and historic interest, as well as the natural beauty of the riverside and Royal Parks (Bushy Park and Richmond Park)?

Strawberry Hill House



Twickenham may be most well-known for its association with rugby, but there are many other prestigious sites in the area too. Among the attractions are: the renowned Twickenham Studios; Sandycome Lodge, the rural retreat of landscape artist J M W Turner; and the magnificent view across the Thames from Richmond Hill to historic Ham House.

You don't even have to leave the St Mary's campus to experience the magnificent 18th-century architecture of Strawberry Hill House, Horace Walpole's 'Little Gothic Castle', which is located in the University's grounds. The house and gardens are open to the public on Sundays, with guided tours available from 10am – see www.strawberryhillhouse.org.uk to find out more.

Alternatively, if you decide to venture slightly further afield and head to the riverside, a stroll along the Thames waterfront will reveal sights such as the quirky Eel Pie Island (the home of rhythm and blues), Teddington Lock, and Marble Hill House, as well as a few pubs with large outdoor areas to relax in.

For the usual attractions of cafés, restaurants, pubs and shops, the choice is endless, with Twickenham and Teddington's more independent offerings on the doorstep, to nearby Richmond and Kingston, where you can find the brands that you know and love.

Of course, if rugby is your thing, a trip to Twickenham's world-famous stadium and Rugby Museum is a must.

Once you've exhausted the local area, and if you've still got energy to spare, you can always jump on a train and explore the hustle and bustle of central London which is just a short train ride away.
